Aerosol Products	To manufacture, store or handle an aggregate quantity of Level 2 or Level 3 aerosol products in excess of 500 pounds (227 kg) net weight.		
Cellulose Nitrate Film - Storage	An operational permit is required to store, handle or use cellulose nitrate film in a Group A occupancy		
Combustible Dust-Producing Operations	An operational permit is required to operate a grain elevator, flour starch mill, feed mill, or a plant pulverizing aluminum, coal, cocoa, magnesium, spices or sugar, or other operations producing combustible dusts as defined in Chapter 2.		
Combustible Fibers	An operational permit is required for the storage and handling of combustible fibers in quantities greater than 100 cubic feet		
Compressed Gases	An operational permit is required for the storage, use or handling at normal temperature and pressure (NTP) of compressed gases in excess of the amounts listed in Table 105.6.8.		
Cryogenic Fluid	An operational permit is required to produce, store, transport on site, use, handle or dispense cryogenic fluids in excess of the amounts listed in Table 105.6.10.		
Cutting and Welding	An operational permit is required to conduct cutting or welding operations within the jurisdiction.		
Explosive-Blasting Agents	An operational permit is required for the manufacture, storage, handling, sale or use of any quantity of explosives, explosive materials, fireworks or pyrotechnic special effects within the scope of Chapter 56. <i>See Health and Safety Code Division 11, Part 1, Sections 12000, et seq. for additional requirements.</i>		
Flammable and Combustible Liquids	1) To store, handle or use Class I liquids in excess of 5 gallons (19 L) in a building or in excess of 10 gallons (37.9 L) outside of a building. 2) To store, handle or use Class II or Class IIIA liquids in excess of 25 gallons (95 L) in a building or in excess of 60 gallons (227 L) outside a building.		
Hazardous Materials	An operational permit is required to store, transport on site, dispense, use or handle hazardous materials in excess of the amounts listed in Table 105.6.20.		
High-Piled Storage	An operational permit is required to use a building or portion thereof with more than 500 square feet (46 m ²), including aisles, of high-piled storage (greater than 12 feet in height).		

Hot-Work Operations	An operational permit is required for hot work including, but not limited to cutting, welding, Thermit welding, brazing, soldering, grinding, thermal spraying, thawing pipe, installation of torch-applied roof systems or any other similar activity.		
Industrial Ovens	An operational permit is required for operation of industrial ovens regulated by Chapter 30.		
LPG storage use	An operational permit is required for: (1) Storage and use of LP-gas (2) Operation of cargo tankers that transport LP-gas.

Magnesium Working	An operational permit is required to melt, cast, heat treat or grind more than 10 pounds (4.54 kg) of magnesium.		
Miscellaneous Combustible Storage	An operational permit is required to store in any building or on any premises in excess of 2,500 cubic feet (71 m ³) gross volume of combustible empty packing cases, boxes, barrels or		
Moible Food Preperation Vehicles	A permit is required for mobile food preparation vehicles equipped with appliances that produce smoke or grease-laden vapors.		
Motor Vehicle Fuel Dispensing	An operational permit is required for the operation of automotive, marine and fleet motor fuel-dispensing facilities.		
Open Burning	An operational permit is required for the kindling or maintaining of an open fire or a fire on any public street, alley, road, or other public or private ground (including cooking operations in a vendor booth).		
Open Flames and Torches	An operational permit is required to remove paint with a torch; or to use a torch or open-flame device in a wildfire risk area.		
Open Flames and Candles	An operational permit is required to use open flames or candles in connection with assembly areas, dining areas of restaurants or drinking establishments.		
Places of Assembly	An operational permit is required to operate a place of assembly.		
Plant Extraction Systems	An operational permit is required to use plant extraction systems.		
Pyroxylin Plastics	An operational permit is required for storage or handling of more than 25 pounds (11 kg) of cellulose nitrate (pyroxylin) plastics, and for the assembly or manufacture of articles involving pyroxylin plastics.		
Repair Garages	An operational permit is required for operation of repair garages.		
Spraying - Dipping	An operational permit is required to conduct a spraying or dipping operation utilizing flammable or combustible liquids, or the application of combustible powders regulated by Chapter 24.		
Storage of Scrap Tire and Tire Byproduct	An operational permit is required to establish, conduct or maintain storage of scrap tires and tire byproducts that exceeds 2,500 cubic feet (71 m ³) of total volume of scrap tires, and for indoor storage of tires and tire byproducts.		
Tents - Canopies	An operational permit is required to operate an air-supported temporary membrane structure, a temporary special event structure or a tent having an area in excess of 400 square feet (37 m ²).		
Waste Handling	An operational permit is required for the operation of wrecking yards, junk yards and waste material-handling facilities.		

Wood Products - Storage	An operational permit is required to store chips, hogged material, lumber or plywood in excess of 200 cubic feet (6 m3).
